## 03.15.01 Dispatch: *Star Trek* Alums at the Daytime Emmys

The National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences has announced its nominations for the 28th Annual Daytime Emmy Awards, and members of the *Star Trek* family are right in the mix.

Earning himself two nominations and even more for his show, LeVar Burton (Geordi La Forge on *Star Trek: The Next Generation*) and *Reading Rainbow* could go home with six Emmys. Burton was personally nominated for Best Performer in a Children's Series and as Executive Producer (with Twila C. Liggett) in the category of Best Children's Series. *Reading Rainbow* also grabbed nominations for Single Camera Photography (Film or Electronic), Directing in a Children's Series, Single Camera Editing and Writing in a Children's Series.

Another TNG acting alum nominated as Executive Producer is Whoopi Goldberg ("Guinan"), nominated in the category of Best Game/Audience Participation Show for the *Hollywood Squares*. Goldberg Executive produces along with John C. Moffitt and Pat Tourk Lee.

Finally, Alfre Woodard is up for Best Performer in a Children's Special for her performance as Clara Collier in "The Wishing Tree." Woodard appeared as Lily Sloane in *Star Trek: First Contact*.

The Daytime Emmy Awards will be handed out on May 18 in New York.

## 03.08.01 Science Roundup: Lightship, Pioneer 10, Space Amoebas, e t c

According to the *Star Trek: Deep Space Nine* episode "Explorers," Bajorans began exploring their solar system about 500 years ago using solar-sail vessels that were propelled by light pressure from the sun. It appears humans are about to catch up. A test flight is scheduled next month for Earth's first solar sail craft, with a full orbital mission planned for later this year.

The Planetary Society has collaborated with Russian space groups to create a solar sail spacecraft that will utilize the Sun's energy as its primary form of propulsion. A sail 30 meters in diameter, divided into eight triangular blades, will be pushed through space by the continuous

thrust of photons from the Sun, carrying the payload at its center with navigation made possible by pitching the blades.

The private space group believes the solar sail craft could pave the way to the other planets and even travel to other stars. "It's the most efficient system we can imagine for transport around the solar system," said Andre Bormanis, science consultant for *Star Trek: Voyager* who is also a consultant with The Planetary Society. "We need new forms of propulsion, and the solar sail will help us get colonies on the Moon and on Mars much more cheaply than current technology will allow." Current spacecraft like the Space Shuttle are inefficient by comparison because chemical fuel adds so much to their weight.

As the ancient Bajorans discovered when they landed on Cardassia, the solar sail could also make interstellar travel practical, according to Bormanis. When a solar sail craft gets beyond the influence of the Sun's energy, a powerful space-based laser—which would also be solar-powered—would continue pushing the vessel toward the next star. "The solar sail can achieve accelerations up to 10 or 15 percent of the speed of light. That would reduce a trip to Alpha Centauri to within the span of a human lifetime," he said. The solar sail ship is dubbed Cosmos 1, named after the principal financier of the project, Cosmos Studios, a science-based entertainment company co-founded by Ann Druyan, widow of the late astronomer Carl Sagan. The test, a sub-orbital flight to deploy two solar sail blades, will take place between April 19 and 24. The actual flight into Earth orbit by the full eight-blade craft is planned for a launch window between October and December.

### Film Gets Wise DVD Treatment

One look at the library of *Star Trek* DVD's currently on the market and one omission leaps out. All of the *Star Trek* films are available on DVD, with the exception of "*Star Trek: The Motion Picture*," the first *Star Trek* film, released in December of 1979, over 20 years ago.

This omission is soon to be rectified, and the result will be more than a standard transfer from VHS to DVD. Paramount Home Entertainment has been working with Robert Wise on the "Director's Edition" of the initial *Star Trek* film, which was created by Robert Wise Productions, and which will feature the visual effects work of Foundation Imaging.

Along with remastering the picture and sound, certain sequences are undergoing enhance-

ment with modern special effects technology to deliver a film-watching experience to the Director's standards. In the original release, time and budgetary constraints prevented Wise from getting his ultimate desired outcome, something the new DVD will rectify.

The enhancements being worked on include cleaning up some of the late 70's special effects by touching up the matte lines on layered shots, replacing shots that were excised from the original due to cost or time constraints, and even adding ambient sound during certain sequences. One of the more exciting aspects of the Director's Edition is the inclusion of newly created imagery.

For example, the establishing shot of the landscape of Vulcan has been re-imagined based on original, unrealized designs for the desolate and arid world, resulting in the panorama pictured at left, with a larger version available here. Foundation also created a new completely digital rendering of the refitted U.S.S. *Enterprise*, beginning with a wire frame version and then adding the considerable detail in the next step (both shots below, or click here for a larger combined view).

In the film, years have passed since the Original Series, and the crewmembers of the *Enterprise* have all moved forward in their lives and careers. When the Federation and Earth specifically are threatened by a mysterious, gigantic, non-corporeal cloud-entity that cuts a destructive path towards Earth, the *Enterprise* is the ship selected for the mission. Admiral James T. Kirk (William Shatner) recognizes the impending peril and convinces Starfleet to return Kirk to the Captain's chair of the *Enterprise*, replacing Captain Will Decker (Stephen Collins).

As Kirk re-assembles his old crew and the threat grows ever closer, an accident in the transporter room kills two, including Sonak, the intended Vulcan Science Officer. After the *Enterprise's* refit is completed, the ship is re-launched back into space from dry dock. After a near miss with a wormhole, a ship makes a rendezvous with the *Enterprise*, delivering a replacement Science Officer, Mr. Spock (Leonard Nimoy).

As the *Enterprise* with her crew encounters the strange entity known as V'Ger, a number of stunning effects sequences unfold, and the Director's Edition DVD will be making the best use of today's technology to enhance these sequences.

The Director's Edition DVD of "*Star Trek: The Motion Picture*" is due to hit stores some time later this year. In the meantime, episodes of the Original Series are being regularly released by Paramount Home Entertainment, with plans underway to bring *Star Trek: The Next Generation*, *Star Trek: Deep Space Nine* and *Star Trek: Voyager* to home video in the increasingly popular DVD format.

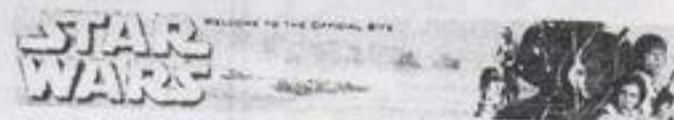

## Star Wars Episode II



March 15, 2001 -- Making the biggest *Star Wars* splash at the 2001 American International Toy Fair were a series of amazingly detailed busts of Episode II characters. The sculptures of Hayden Christensen, Ewan McGregor, Natalie Portman, Samuel L. Jackson, Christopher Lee and Temuera Morrison were astonishingly accurate. They were the product of Gentle Giant Studios, a rapidly growing company based out of Burbank, California.

"For Episode II we came to Australia and we brought an arsenal of scanners," explains Karl Meyer, President of Gentle Giant Studios, "including a head scanner, an object scanner, a full body scanner and also a scanner that is specific to scanning large objects like speeders or spaceships or sets." Gentle Giant uses laser scanners to digitally record the geometry of real world objects -- faces, bodies, props, and more. Once recorded as digital information, those features can be reproduced in a variety of forms. The polygonal shapes can be used to create video game models, virtual stand-ins for visual effects sequences, or-- of greatest interest to collectors-- exact likeness and detail for toy figure sculptures and accessory molding.

"Once we get the three-dimensional information into the computer we can import it into different types of programs," explains Meyer. "We can create a Stereo Lithography file -- an STL file -- which is sent to one of our rapid prototyping machines. That can build the piece at whatever size we tell it to build." Gentle Giant Studios is at the forefront of this innovation, being one of the only companies offering this increasingly common tool in

filmmaking. "3-D scanners have been used and applied to filmmaking many times in the past," says Meyer, "but this is the first time that a dedicated team with as many scanners as we've brought came down to do a data collection that serves the licensed product people and also works as an archiving process."

Gentle Giant landed the Episode II contract after a successful demonstration of their capabilities at Lucasfilm's headquarters.

"We actually came out to Skywalker Ranch and drove out there in our Scan Van," explains Meyer. "It's a big purple Winnebago that's all decked out inside and has several scanners onboard."

One of the test subjects taken inside the Scan Van was the President of Lucas Licensing, Howard Roffman.

"After doing our little dog and pony show, we came back and made Howard Roffman action figures and sent them back up, just to show as proof of this whole process," says Meyer. "The results were incredible, and warranted us coming down to Australia."

"One day a box arrived with perfect reproductions of my head on Luke Skywalker and Obi-wan Kenobi figures, both 4-inch and 12-inch," recalls Roffman. "I think I felt a little bit like Luke when he cuts off Vader's head in the cave on Dagobah and sees himself! This was clearly the future and we had to be there with *Star Wars*."

The digital information gathered by Meyer's scanners can be used to build models of various sizes, from full-scale reproductions down to the 3-3/4 inch scale action figure collectors are used to.

"I think somebody that is a stickler about accuracy or authenticity is going to really appreciate this process, because it's the 3-D equivalent of taking a photograph of something as opposed to painting an interpretation of what you see," says Meyer. "When we scan, say, Christopher Lee and then output the scan as a sculpture, it's going to be a perfect miniature."

"Instead of having a Podracer toy that you can tell is a toy, you'll have a Podracer toy that looks more like the visual effects model," offers Gentle Giant Technical Specialist Steve Chapman. While a mass-produced toy may never match the intricate details found in a handcrafted model, the capability now exists to get even closer than ever before. Such digital innovations -- which seem commonplace in *Star Wars* productions -- often spark concerns from those more traditionally minded. For instance, what does the future hold for traditional toy sculptors?

Meyer brushes off such concerns; he points out that Gentle Giant Studios has tripled the amount of sculptors on staff since their move to digital scanning. "These scanners are really just another set of tools," he says. "It's the equivalent of Adobe PhotoShop or Illustrator to a graphic artist. It just heightens your speed and ability to do certain things. There's always going to be a need for human hands, and everything that we do is touched by human hands. Computers aren't creative and they don't put flair into things. That's the beauty about having this equipment: we can capture the foundation and structure of reality, and then put it into somebody's hands and take it anywhere we want to go with it."
