AND... Alien Encounter July 13-15!

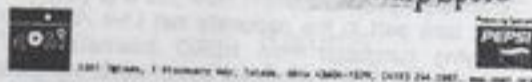
A unique Sci-Fi experience where you can come face to face with your favorite Star Trek alien race from a far away galaxy.

~Where No Man Has Gone Before~ with special guest stars Gary Lockwood ("2001: A SPACE ODYSSEY") and Sally Kellerman ("M*A*S*H") may have been the syndicated pilot of STAR TREK for the past three decades. But now in the new millennium it has been decided apparently by the powers that be for the original broadcast premiere pilot to now become the syndicated pilot. That episode was and is ~The Man Trap~ guest starring the late Emmy winning actor Michael Zaslow (who is remembered by daytime soap opera fans as GUIDING Light's villainous Roger Thorpe) as the first doomed Enterprise crewmember in the history of STAR TREK which had also been the first recorded opportunity for Dr. Leonard "Bones McCoy" to say ~Dead, Jim!~ thus having two reasons for being arguably the most memorable introduction to STAR TREK. My votes for the best alien creatures from the original STAR TREK include the shape-shifting salt-vampire that could appear as any crewmember

I agree with practically all Trekkers that ~The City On The Edge Of Forever~ featuring guest star Joan Collins, ~STAR TREK: FIRST CONTACT~ with appearances by Alfre Woodard and James Cromwell, ~STAR TREK IV: THE VOYAGE HOME~ and STAR TREK: DEEP SPACE 9's Trials And Tribble-Ations are the four best time travel storylines throughout the epic of STAR TREK. The special appearance by Oscar winning actor F. Murray Abraham as the alien



villain in ~STAR TREK: INSURRECTION~ may have been the most appealing casting choice in the STAR TREK film adaptations since Christopher Plummer as the Klingon General Chang in STAR TREK VI: THE UNDISCOVERED COUNTRY.

Emmy nominated actors Leonard Nimoy (for STAR TREK's three seasons from 1966 to 1969) and William Shatner (for THIRD ROCK FROM THE SUN in 1999) will always be one of the best male duos of the passing millennium as both Lucy Lawless and Renee O'Connor for XENA: WARRIOR PRINCESS promise to be a front runner for one of the best female duos of the new millennium. Captain Picard, Captain Sisko, Captain Janeway and their Star Fleet crews with no disrespect intended shall always despite their own fame and fortune never be as original in comparison to Kirk, Spock, Bones, Scotty, Chekov, Lt. Uhura and Sulu have always been and forever shall be where none of us have ever gone before.

05.03.01 Dispatch: Goldberg's Award has Ironic Star Trek Twist

Whoopi Goldberg (Guinan on Star Trek: The Next Generation) will add another award to her already-impressive collection of accolades. The former TNG star and current center square on the syndicated game show *The Hollywood Squares* will be the recipient of the fourth annual Mark Twain Prize for Humor. Given out by the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington D.C., the award is, according to the Kennedy Center's official Web site, "a tribute to the shtick, gags, wry anecdotes, and unflinching observations that remind us that we are human."

The prestigious award is not Goldberg's first brush with the celebrated American author of "Tom Sawyer" and "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn." Star Trek fans remember that Goldberg has spent some screen time with the author (or at least a close facsimile in actor Jerry Hardin) in the two-part TNG episode "Time's Arrow," where Guinan's encounter with Mark Twain played a key role in the plot. "Our dear Mr. Twain put it best," said Goldberg, "when he said 'Humor is the good-natured side of the truth.' I am deeply honored to join the ranks of Carl Reiner, Jonathan Winters and Richard Pryor, who, along with the great Samuel Clemens, are some of the most fabulous truth-tellers of our time." Pryor, Winters and Reiner are the three previous recipients of the award, in that order.

The official awards ceremony will be held this fall on Monday, October 15 at the Kennedy Center, in a star-studded ceremony, which will benefit the Kennedy Center Education Department to foster young American humorists. Goldberg will receive a copy of an 1884 bronze portrait bust of Mark Twain sculpted by Karl Gerhardt.

05.01.01 Dispatch: Shatner Charity Horse Show Roundup

The neighs have it — William Shatner's 11th Annual Cosequin Hollywood Charity Horse Show was a rousing success, raising hundreds of thousand of dollars for charities to benefit children.

Final tallies are not yet available, but this year's total is expected to well exceed last year's take of \$200,000. Money was raised not only from ticket sales to the Horse Show—the main event for which took place Saturday—but also from a silent auction of Star Trek and other show business-related memorabilia, and a Western Dinner Party featuring entertainer Rita Coolidge, all held at the Los Angeles Equestrian Center.

About 2500 children were in attendance from LA's BEST, one of the beneficiaries of the fundraiser, to spend Saturday afternoon getting to know Clydesdales and Spanish Horses and to participate in other activities, and then to cheer the riders in the evening's show.

In a Shatner-inspired twist to your normal horse show, volunteers helping to entertain the children included members of two Star Trek fan clubs — one local and one from Las Vegas — who were there in costume. Starfleet personnel, Klingons and even a Mugato marched alongside medieval knights and princesses and modern-day mounted policemen in a "Time Parade of Heroes" that kicked off the main show in the Equidome.

After a galloping welcome by Shatner, a demonstration from *Ahead with Horses*—another charity benefiting from the occasion—showed how disabled children can benefit from exercises performed on horseback and have a lot of fun doing it. The main attraction was a medieval-style tournament featuring jousting and swordfighting among the Imperial Knights of Moreno Valley, California, who were "competing" for the hand of the "princess"—one of the disabled children from the *Ahead with Horses* program. Shatner closed the show in the Renaissance spirit, raising a sword and declaring, "Above all else, love."

Ahead with Horses is a therapeutic riding group for handicapped children, and LA's BEST (Better Educated Students for Tomorrow) is a program to provide supervised after-school education for children ages 5 to 12 in Los Angeles. The third beneficiary this year is The Children's Museum of Los Angeles, a play-centered arts environment that encourages children to think creatively.

The Hollywood Charity Horse Show is an annual event that started in 1990 after Shatner first watched an exhibition sponsored by *Ahead With Horses*. The famous equine enthusiast (who, of course, gained worldwide fame playing "Captain Kirk") saw children so severely handicapped they could not hold their head up perform intricate exercises on horseback. Shatner was deeply affected by what he had seen. "You can't watch these kids without knowing you have to help, somehow," he said.



05.01.01 Dispatch: Masterson to Crown Sexiest Geek Alive

For the second year in a row, Chase Masterson ("Leeta" in Star Trek: Deep Space Nine) will help prove to the world that being a geek is cool. The shapely Dabo girl

will host the finals of the second annual Sexiest Geek Alive contest to be held in San Jose, California, on June 21.

Star Wars Episode II



Breaking the Celluloid Ceiling

At this year's NAB Conference in Las Vegas, representatives from Lucasfilm were featured in a video highlighting the revolutionary process of shooting Episode II on all-digital cameras. Sony and Panavision pooled their expertise to provide director George Lucas with digital 24-frame progressive high definition cameras to use instead of traditional film cameras. "It's as profound a change as going from silent to talkies and going from black and white to color," said Lucas in the presentation. "I've always been pushing the envelope of the medium, because I want to get the best possible image in the best possible way in telling my stories. I've always found myself bumping up against this celluloid ceiling of technology that says 'You can't go here; you can't go there; you can't do that.'"

The new digital cameras make obsolete those technical limitations. "The [new] possibilities center around malleability in terms of what you can do with the image, how you can change the image and work with it. That's the biggest issue the film-

maker will be faced with," said Lucas. "The equipment is easier to use and that allows you to get more angles and do more things than you'd normally be able to do. And once you've captured the image, the digital technology allows you to do an unlimited amount of changes and work in different ways that were not possible with the photo-chemical process."



Post Production Supervisor Mike Blanchard cited an example of the amount of time saved not waiting for traditional film processing. "Basically, we'd have an editorial assistant take the tape from the two cameras at lunch time to a down conversion and cloning station," said Blanchard. "In real time, say you've got 25 minutes of material -- 25 minutes later you were delivering a tape to the Editorial Department, and we were logging and cutting."

Using largely the same crew as he did for Episode I, Lucas noted the time saved. "I was able to go from 26 setups a day to 37 setups a day," the director said. "I was able to shoot under schedule by three days, and a lot of this has to do with not having that extra hour at night watching

dailies. Not having to do this reloading and that sort of thing, it speeds up the process in terms of the amount of work you can do in a day."

"There are substantial cost savings," added Producer Rick McCallum. "On Star Wars alone we believe we saved just over 1.7 million dollars shooting on Hi-Def."

Though some debate the quality of a digital image compared to a 35mm film image, many prominent directors have gone on record in favor of digital's picture quality. "I think Episode II looks better than Episode I in terms of the technical quality of the image," Lucas said. "James Cameron, Francis Ford Coppola and a lot of other directors have come through here to see what we're doing. They're very enthusiastic about digital, and are amazed at what we've been able to accomplish. We had no problems whatsoever with the camera or the medium or anything. We shot in the desert. We shot in the rain. We shot in all kinds of conditions. The picture looks absolutely gorgeous."

"I'm completely sold on digital," added Lucas. "I can't imagine ever going back."
